SERMON TITLE: "THE HOLY SPIRIT AND YOU" Psalm 139:13-16; Pastor Tom Olson, May 23, 2021

Dear Friends, Grace be to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen

BESTIE: If someone asked you the question, "Who has been with you the longest and had the greatest impact on your life, what would you say?" Many of us would say our parents. We might say our spouse. We also might mention a friend we have had since early childhood. But that is not the correct answer. There is one who has been with you since the day you were conceived and has been your unseen guide, protector, enabler and friend and that is the Holy Spirit. No matter how much we have ignored or grieved the Holy Spirit, the Spirit

has not given up on us or left us. We would not be here today wanting to hear the Word of God if He had left us. The Holy Spirit wants to become a much greater and more real presence and source of connection with God the Father and Christ than we can imagine. We are invited by Scripture to (*Ephesians 8:15*) "be filled with the Holy Spirit" to the point that (*John 7:38*) "rivers of living water" are flowing out from us to a dry and thirsty land. Imagine that!

NEED: Is there anything that we need more today as a church than to cultivate an amazing relationship with the Holy Spirit of God? That relationship releases beautiful fruit, useful and powerful gifts, amazing comfort and observable personality change. Let's take a few moments to look into Psalm 139, the great "sanctity of life" Psalm, and observe THE PRESENCE OF THE SPIRIT OF GOD IN OUR LIVES.

I. CREATED: YOUR FIRST ACQUAINTANCE

Psalm 139:13-16a For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. 14 I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. 15 My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place. When I was woven together in the depths of the earth, 16 your eyes saw my unformed body...



(Allen Ludke 1947-2021)

ALLEN: This past week Allen Ludke died and the world didn't notice. He was 74 years old, he had Downs Syndrome and diabetes, he was pretty much alone in this world after his parents died. Sharon's cousin watched over him in the last years of his life because he really had no one else who cared. He lived in the little low-income apartment building in Almena, Wisconsin that Sharon's mom and dad lived in the last few years. I always enjoyed visiting with him, he sat at the front door and cheerfully greeted those who came. Allen was a gentle giant and would not hurt a fly. He was proud to be a member of the Missouri Synod church. The pro-abortion politicians tell us that people like Allen should be aborted and not allowed to be born. Yet I found him to be one of the friendliest men I have ever met!

HISTORY: We see here that the Holy Spirit was with Allen from the moment of conception. God's Word tells us that he was fearfully and wonderfully made, YES, EVEN WITH DOWN'S SYNDROME. It tells us that he was knitted together by God. We see in verse 16 that God had his eyes on Allen in the womb and Psalm 121 tells us that God's eyes are on His people day and night for the rest of our lives. Allen may have felt lonely at times. Sharon's parents did their best to befriend him and share good food with him. Day and night the Holy Spirit never left him and yesterday He had a Christian Funeral at the little country church called "Silver Creek Lutheran."

SPECIAL: Allen's life was planned by God. There were many so called "normal" people living in that apartment building who never even noticed me when I came. They didn't give me a friendly greeting like Allen did. They were not proud to be a member of a church. The Holy Spirit made Allen special, in spite of what others called him. And Allen is the only one from that building that I will remember.

SPIRIT: That same Holy Spirit was with you since the moment you were conceived. The Spirit brooded over the ancient waters as the world was created and he brooded over you as you were being formed. The Spirit skillfully knitted you together. The Spirit kept watch over you and still does, day and night without slumber nor sleep. He knows you intimately. The Spirit gives us gifts. The Spirit produces fruit in us: *Galatians 5-love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness and self-control.* The Spirit convicts us of sin. The Spirit comforts us when we are sorrowful. The Spirit is called the "paraclete" or the "one who comes along side of us." It is almost like that idea of one who gives us a big hug when we need it.

WELCOME: Friends, we are not alone! The Holy Spirit IS WITH US. The Holy Spirit wants a deeper relationship with us. I am so sad that I have not recognized the Holy Spirit in my life as I should have. "Welcome Holy Spirit in my heart! Thank you for being patient with me when I ignore you. You created me and you were my first friend. I want you to be my constant companion every day!"

II. ORDAINED: YOUR GREATEST SUPPORTER

Psalm 139:16b ... All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be.

BOOK: I remember how excited Nelly Sealy was when one of the workers at Augustana Care Center told her that she liked her writings and would like to edit them into a book about her life. Is it a "God thing" that a nursing home aid would also be a writer and book publisher...perhaps even an "angel in disguise?" Nellie's writings about her childhood, rebellious years, tragic marriage and alcoholism and her glorious conversion to a living faith in Jesus were put together by this NURSING HOME AID into a lovely book that has been distributed all over. With her many trips to the hospital, each unit where she stayed had books given to doctors and nurses and her testimony has been read time and again. We now know a lot about the little spot in the road called Pencer, Minnesota where the Wallstads had their general store. And we know about Jesus transformed a broken life.

OURS: Will you and I ever have a book about our lives? We already do! The author is God. Notice this verse says that "ALL THE DAYS ORDAINED FOR ME WERE WRITTEN IN <u>YOUR BOOK</u> BEFORE ONE OF THEM CAME TO BE." God has a book, it is about our lives, our days are described before they come to pass. This is amazing. It reminds us that God has good plans for our lives.

EMMY: Little baby "Emmy" who died at four months of age had a book too. Not a thick book, but an important book. The days of her life were written by God, with tears instead of ink. And it is just as important of a book as someone who lives to be 100 years old. I believe that Emmy's family said that her presence was like "God with us." That is because the Holy Spirit was with Emmy and she was fulfilling her part of God's plan. Now she is with God and experiencing the main part of the book written for her, the chapters about heaven. She is in the light and presence of the Lord. The Spirit of God is there and she feels the comfort of that. I love the line from the hymn, "We feebly struggle, they in glory shine!"

FINISH: But we must finish off our race here below. God has plans for us, good plans, plans for today! Jeremiah 29:11 tells about the plans of God for Israel and uses terms like, "plans for good and not evil, plans to give a future and a hope." We need to be excited about God's plans for us. They may not be easy plans. Nellie's life book was filled with much physical pain in the last chapter. But it always works out for good. Romans 8:28 is always true for the child of God. What He has written in his book for us "works together for good."

TEARS: We need to walk in step with the Spirit so we can experience what is in God's book for us. I have often said that the tears of heaven God wipes away will be the tears we cry when we read God's book for our lives and see all the wonderful things He wanted for us, that we missed because of our stubbornness and unbelief. We miss what God has when we don't have the faith to step out when He calls us to do so.

ORDAINED: GOD IS OUR GREATEST SUPPORTER. God is our fan. He has written a book for us. The saints in glory are cheering us on. We need to run the race that God has set out for us keeping our eyes on Jesus. We need to be listening moment by moment to the prompting of the Holy Spirit. Plug your ears to the devil's temptations. God gently leads us in "paths of righteousness for His name's sake."

OUR LIFE IS ORDAINED, THE SPIRIT OF GOD IS OUR GREATEST SUPPORTER.

III. REMEMBERED: YOUR TRUEST FRIEND

Psalm 139:17&18 How precious to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them! 18 Were I to count them, they would outnumber the grains of sand. When I awake, I am still with you.

CONFIDANT: Proverbs 18:24 reminds us that the wrong friends ruin us but also that "there is a friend that sticks closer than a brother." That friend is the Holy Spirit of the Lord Jesus Christ. According to these verses He:

- ...He has many thoughts about us...like a lover, he thinks about us day and night.
- His thoughts toward us are limitless...greater than the number of sands on the seashore.
- He is ever present in our lives, even when we sleep and awaken. He doesn't leave us... Deuteronomy 31:6 Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the LORD your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you."

DISAPPEARING: Our friends my move away and drift out of our lives. Our loved ones will eventually die one by one. My parents are gone from my life...Sharon's parents are soon to follow them out of here. But Jesus, by His Holy Spirit, will never leave us. An ancient hymn written by Johan Frank in the 1600's is one of my favorites, really puts it well:

1. Jesus. Priceless treasure, Source of purest pleasure, Truest friend to me:
Ah, how long I've panted
And my heart hath faint-ed,
Thirsting, Lord, for Thee.
Thine I am, O spotless Lamb!
I will suffer naught to hide Thee,
Naught I ask beside Thee.

- 2. In Thine arms I rest me,
 Foes who would molest me
 Cannot reach me here;
 Tho' the earth be shaking,
 Ev'ry heart be quaking,
 Jesus calms my fear;
 Fires may flash and thunder crash,
 Yea, and sin and hell assail me,
 Jesus will not fail me.
- 3. Hence with earthly treasure!
 Thou art all my pleasure,
 Jesus, all my choice;
 Hence Thou empty glory!
 Naught to me thy story,
 Told with tempting voice'
 Pain or loss, or shame, or cross,
 Shall not from my Savior move me,

- 4. Fare thee well that errest,

 Thou wilt tempt in vain;

 Jesus, priceless treasure.

BETHANY: Sharon and I are reading the history of "Bethany Fellowship" in Bloomington where she went to missionary college. It all began with a group of young families that above all else wanted to be filled with the Holy Spirit and totally yielded to God's purposes for their lives. They wanted to be used by God to send 100 missionaries out into the world with the good news of the gospel...and they far exceeded that number and their work goes on with great power even after they have all died. What are the keys to being filled with and used by the Holy Spirit? Perhaps you would like to be filled with and used by God in an extraordinary way. Here are the keys:

- 1. **DESIRE:** You need to want to be filled and ask for it. Luke 11:13 "If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"
- 2. EAT: Feed your soul on the Word of God. Two parallel verses in the Epistles show us that a Spirit-filled Christian is a Word-filled Christian. Ephesians 5:18&19 ...be filled with the Holy Spirit, speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, Colossians 3:16&17 "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."

 3. YIELD: Then as the Holy Spirit speaks to you it is necessary to yield to Him or He will be grieved and withdraw. Ephesians 4:30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

Now may the peace of God that surpasses all understanding, guard your hearts and minds through faith in Christ Jesus. Amen
